Abstract

This paper introduces a theory and research design that attempts to explain and predict levels of regional integration worldwide. The central argument is that the likelihood of institutionalized regional integration increases under a power preponderance structural condition and high levels of trade which promote homogenization of domestic institutions. The paper reviews prior work on regional integration and then contributes to the scholarship by synthesizing the findings of the power transition and institutional schools. Systematic testing of the hypotheses is introduced in the preliminary research design.
